Letter from the Locum

Covid-19 Virus: Update

As indicated in the last Focus the Session had put in place a number of arrangements to deal with the exceptional circumstances arising from the current Covid-19 crisis. Here is an update.

Church Services

Sunday services are still cancelled and are unlikely to start before 12 July at the earliest. Churches may be able to open for private prayer but not before 18 June. We await guidance on arrangements to permit this and will try to facilitate if there is a demand. Funerals are still not permitted in Church and this is unlikely to change before 9 July. We realise that this is difficult for people wishing to pay their respects but hope that there is understanding in these very unusual times.

Church Centre Development - Help still needed

Just a quick reminder that the Church still has two loans totalling £25,000 to repay over the next 5 years. Loan repayments total £5,588 per year. This is in addition to our ordinary expenditure.

However there is still a significant shortfall in pledges to cover these repayments. We are proposing to run a number of fundraisers once we are able to. But, there is a greater Power, the Creator and controller of these terrible incidents—God.



Thursdays in Black

I was recently alerted to this campaign through our Guild Weekly News. I would like to make as many people as possible aware of it, and invite them to wear black on Thursdays to show their solidarity with the fight against all forms of violence including domestic violence which has been of particular concern during this time of lockdown.

Some of us in Portsoy are already wearing black on Thursdays, which coincides at present with the evening of clapping for the NHS, so look out for any of your neighbours who are showing their support, and consider joining us.

Thursdays in Black grew out of the World Council of Churches (WCC) Decade of Churches in Solidarity with Women (1988-1998), in which the stories of rape as a weapon of war, gender injustice, abuse, violence, and many tragedies that grow outward from such violence became all the more visible. But what also became visible were women's resilience, and their personal efforts to resist such violations.

The campaign was inspired by:

- The Mothers of the Disappeared in Buenos Aires, Argentina who on Thursdays protested at the Plaza de Mayo, against the disappearance of their children during the violent dictatorship.
- The Women in Black in Israel and Palestine, who even now protest against war and violence.
- Women in Rwanda and Bosnia who were protesting against the use of rape as a weapon of war during the genocide. Black Sash movement in South Africa protesting against apartheid and its use of violence against black people.

The campaign is simple but profound. Wear black on Thursdays, and at other times wear a pin to declare you are part of the global movement resisting attitudes and practices that permit rape and violence. Show your respect for men and women who are resilient in the face of injustice and violence. Encourage others to join you. Often black has been used with negative racial connotations. In this campaign black is used as a colour of resistance and resilience.
