Letter from the Locum



A recent front page newspaper article told us that 'Anxiety levels in Scotland have increased in recent years.' Therefore they were on the increase long before concerns over the coronavirus. And of course at a nationwide level, in addition, we have also been going through Brexit and the possibility of a vote on independence. And most people face other, more personal issues, such as health concerns, money worries, family problems.... you can probably add more items to the list.

Whenever I find myself developing anxiety over something, I find it helpful to stop and ask myself: 'What can actually go wrong here?' I ask that because in my opinion uncertainty/the fear of things going wrong is at the root of anxious thinking. Or to put it more positively, we relax when we feel everything is going well.

Now the issues which I mentioned above are all uncertain and largely outside of our control, so it is natural that they, and other issues, have led more and more folk to feel anxious. But as someone said: 'there is nothing new under the sun,' and so throughout history there has never been a time when anxiety didn't affect humanity. For instance, back in the time of the bible, the writer of the collection of wise sayings found in it called 'Proverbs,' said: 'An anxious heart weighs a man down but a good word makes him glad.' And certainly a word of support or advice at the correct time can relieve the most troubling circumstance.

But, what if the uncertainty can't be resolved? What if it concerns an issue which is truly outside of our control? Is

there any hope, or do we just inevitably join the company of those who make up the number of anxious folk in Scotland? There isn't anything wrong with talking to yourself occasionally, despite what others may tell you! And when in dire straits at one time, the writer of Psalm 42 asked himself: 'Why are you anxious, O my soul. Why are you so disturbed within me?' And he answered his own question with sound advice: 'Put your hope in God, my Saviour and my God.' This man had faith in God, but let's note how he described God-as his Saviour.

If as I said above, anxiety occurs within us when we fear something in our lives may go wrong, I would say it is a big advantage to believe in God. But how much better if we don't just believe in his existence but also that he can do something about our problem...that he can save us? God sent Jesus to earth to be the one who can save us. And if we have handed Jesus control of our lives, then the salvation which we consequently receive, will lead to either a change in our troubling circumstances or it will give us the assurance that we will be strengthened to successfully face them. Therefore 'why be anxious, O my soul?'

At last, a Sole Nominee

The wait is almost over. After four years of patient work, quite a number of enquiries and several applications, our Nominating Committee has now chosen a Sole Nominee whom they propose to the congregation to be our new Minister. The name of the person is John Gow who has recently completed his training for the ministry.

The next stage is for John to preach as Sole Nominee, and arrangements are now being made by the Kirk Session for John to conduct the service in the Church on Sunday 15th November. Because of the current restrictions, including the much reduced seating capacity in the church, special arrangements are being made to enable members and adherents who won't be able to attend the service in person to see and hear the service in different ways. A video of the service will be posted on the Church website, DVD and CD recordings will be made available to members on request and, if there is a demand, arrangements will also be made to provide a phone link to the recording.

Some two weeks before the service, all members and adherents on the Church Electoral Register will receive full details of the arrangements, a return slip to indicate their preference for seeing and hearing John's service, and details of how the ballot will be conducted. While we will accommodate as many people who wish to come to the service as possible, priority will be given to those who do not have internet access and are unable to view the video of the service online.

We look forward to your participation in this important moment in the life of our congregation.

Our church supports 2 homeless supported accommodation units in Elgin. Covesea House for 16-24 year olds and Guildry House for those aged over 24 years.

The service offers residential accommodation in a flat sharing environment with access to staff 24/7, 365 days of the year. Staff will work alongside those using the service to help them with cooking, cleaning, budgeting, shopping as well as educational and employment prospects, addiction issues, relationships and wellbeing.

The service aims to offer increased opportunities, reduce isolation, support emotional welfare and gives people a safe and stable space when they need it most.

All dried and canned food Items are greatly appreciated.

At this time cereals, cooking sauces, cooking oil and Fray Bento's Pies and non-food items of toiletries would be especially well received.

Information on Sunday Worship

The Church is now open for worship every Sunday morning at 10.30am and we would be delighted if you can join us. We have been open for several weeks now and feel confident that it is safe to attend. But, it is essential to sanitise your hands before entry, wear a mask, maintain two metre physical distancing and provide contact details. We cannot sing, but we do play videos of the hymns. Raymond also kindly plays the organ before and after the service. Unfortunately we still cannot offer teas and coffees after the service and we need to socialise outside after the service, rather than within the Sanctuary.

The general arrangements to keep you safe are as follows:

- You must wear a mask while in the building unless you are exempt from doing so. We have spare masks if needed.
- You must maintain the appropriate physical distancing and good hand hygiene while you are in the building.
- As entrance area is small, please be patient to allow for physical distancing of 2 metres. You may need to queue outside until you can safely enter.
- We will ask if you are well and if you have any Covid-19 symptoms. If you are unwell, especially with any symptoms of Covid-19, please do not attend Church.
- Chairs are placed to allow physical distancing. Please do not move the chairs. If you are with someone from your own household please use the chairs which are in pairs.
- Please try to minimise points you touch in the building.
 Ideally only touch the chair you are sitting on.
- The spacing of chairs limits the size of our congregation to a safe maximum of 37. This means we may have to limit attendance. So far we have not been near that number.

- Sanitising gel dispensers are provided at the entrance and within the sanctuary. Please use these when you come into the building and before you take your seat.
- You must not sing along with the videos, although the words will be displayed. Very difficult, but please try to comply.
- If you need to use the toilet, you can. But, there is a limit of 1 person in each toilet. Please respect this rule and try to maintain physical distancing while using the facilities.
- If you become unwell during the service please immediately alert one of the elders on duty.
- If you are in the highly vulnerable category, please consider carefully if you should stay at home. The services are videoed and we post the recordings on the website and produce CDs/DVDs so you can enjoy the services from your own home. The Church of Scotland has produced an assessment tool which can be found on the Church of Scotland website* We recommend you use it to help you decide if you should attend. We can provide a printed copy if you prefer. Please contact Steve if you would like this.
- We must collect contact details for all attending the service., every week. Please be patient and provide the information when asked even if you have provided it many times before.
